

Curriculum Vitae for Dr. Oscar Kambona Ouma, Dr. rer. Nat., PhD

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Summary

Dr. Kambona was born on April 25th 1968 in Mfangano Island, Lake Victoria, Kenya. He is married to Caroline Kambona and together have three children. He trained in Forestry – Wood Science & Technology at undergraduate level from Moi University, Kenya, graduating in 1991. In 1993, he proceeded to Bishop Heber College of the Bharathidasan University in South India where he successfully pursued a Master of Science degree in Environmental Science, completing in 1995. For one year, he worked as a project officer with Kenya Energy and Environment Organizations (KENGO) in a multi-disciplinary environmental air quality monitoring project. A year later, he took up a position as a Lecturer (Environment, Project Planning & Management) at the Kenya School of Governance. While working at the School of Governance, he won the North-South Dialogue Scholarship program in 2002 to pursue a Doctoral degree in Natural Science (Geography) at the University of Salzburg, Austria. His area of research concentration is: *Environmental Protection, Ecotourism and Rural Livelihoods: The case of the Kakamega Forest Region, Kenya*. Upon completion of his doctoral studies in 2005, he took up a position at Maseno University, where he currently works as a Senior Lecturer of Ecotourism and Sustainable Tourism. While in Maseno University, Dr. Kambona also worked as

the Chairman of the Department of Ecotourism, Hotel and Institution Management for close to 10 years. During this period, he provided administrative, teaching and research leadership. He has taught many undergraduate students and supervised over 20 masters and doctoral students. He has widely published in the area of Sustainable tourism and Hospitality with over 30 papers published in peer reviewed journals; 5 book chapters and 1 book review. He has participated in over 20 international and local conferences. Dr. Kambona is an Ernst Match Post-Doc research fellow, University of Salzburg, Austria. His post-doc research focused on developing a Livelihood-Conservation model using experiences from Kakamega Forest, Kenya and Berchtesgaden National Park, Germany. His research findings have provided insight into and increased understanding of the often delicate balance between Protected Area Conservation, Tourism and Livelihoods. In January 2020, he became a founding member of the African - Austrian Research Network (AfriUniNet) which facilitates North-South and South-South research partnership. He is the Maseno University representative to the AfriUniNet. He is also a member of the IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas - Tourism and Protected Area Specialist Group (TAPAS). Dr. Kambona is an Internationally Certified Green flag trails auditor and an International board member of the World Trails Network. Locally, he has been a member of various institutional boards such as Thurgem Secondary School, Alliance Française-Kisumu Chapter and the National Technical Training Committee, Directorate of Industrial Training, Nairobi. He is currently a member of several school boards. Since 2019, he is an appointed member of the Public Service Board of Kisumu County where he serves as a tourism expert.
